He addressed student claims related to discrimination, academic grievances, and administrative disputes while ensuring compliance with Title IX, ADA, and other relevant federal and state educational regulations.

In 2020, Mr. Soto-Fortuño co-founded a Limited Liability Company focused on real estate and development. He took on a pivotal role in analyzing, strategically planning and managing the company's inaugural project, which achieved a remarkable 35% return on investment.

Before attending law school, Mr. Soto-Fortuño distinguished himself as an influential student representative at the University of Puerto Rico, Ponce Campus.
